



HOW DO YOU KEEP THOSE PESKY FLIES AWAY, ZIP-LOCK BAGS?

Many people swear that a zip-lock bag filled half-way with water and attached over entry-ways will repel flies. No one yet knows how or why it works, but there is speculation that it has something to do with the way the moving water refracts light.

CAT AGGRESSIVENESS PROBLEM SOLVED HOLISTICALLY

This was Joan's problem:

First, you are to be commended! Wonderful of you to do what you do! We adopted two male cats from the shelter before Christmas. They were in the same large kennel but arrived about a week apart. They got along well at first but have now escalated to fighting almost every day--They are our barn cats and I don't want to give them up but this is our first set of cats ever and we're wondering if you could give me some helpful advice in making them be civil. They have their own "space" to eat--one in the stairwell and the other in his own stall. They can come and go as they please. Any suggestions on stopping them from fighting?

This was Joan's solution:

Hi Lynea--I just wanted to update you on this situation where we adopted two male cats from the same shelter and same cage. We first tried Clomicalm from the vet for about a month--it did nothing to make JT more compatible with Yang. However, I kept researching and found a company that had something called "Peacemaker" from Spirit Essences. So far, it has been a great item. We first were giving it orally to JT (problem child) and then started to keep Yang in a separate stall letting JT run free. Then we added it to their food and water bowls. We now only give it to JT orally about once or twice a week and mainly it is in their food bowls and water bowls in the barn. They both now are free to come and go as they please. It has made JT more accepting (it's not 100 percent--nothing is) of Yang. Life is a little easier and they both know that they both are loved and are there to stay. SPECIAL REQUEST FROM OUR VOLUNTEER, KATHY SCHEER

I received a phone call from one of the residents at Emergency Housing in Fresno requesting assistance in trapping and fixing a feral colony. One of the employees working there has been feeding them but has been unable to get them fixed. Over the last two months we have spayed 7 females, 3 males, and removed 9 kittens to foster homes. We have found homes for 4 of these kittens. The other 5 will be ready for adoption by the end of September.

We get a lot of calls from people who request help with trapping and transportation to get the cats spayed/neutered. We need volunteers who would be willing to help with this project. The only way we will ever decrease the number of cats being euthanized is to spay/neuter. Help us do that! We also removed one adult to foster care and needs a home. She is a Ragdoll mix named Gabriela and is very friendly and under one year of age.

Q & A

Question: What is my cat's age in human years? **Answer:** Keep in mind that variable factors, such as heredity, diet, environment, and physical and medical care may affect your cat's comparative age to that of a human. Although you probably don't have any control over heredity, you do have options for controlling the other factors which control your cat's aging process.



The kitten shown here is 6.5 weeks old. As you can see, he's far advanced physically over a human baby of that age.

Here's How:

- 1. Allow 15 human years for the first year of your cat's life.
- 2. Add nine years for the second year. A two-year old cat will approximate 24 human years.
- 3. Add four human years each for successive years of his life.
